

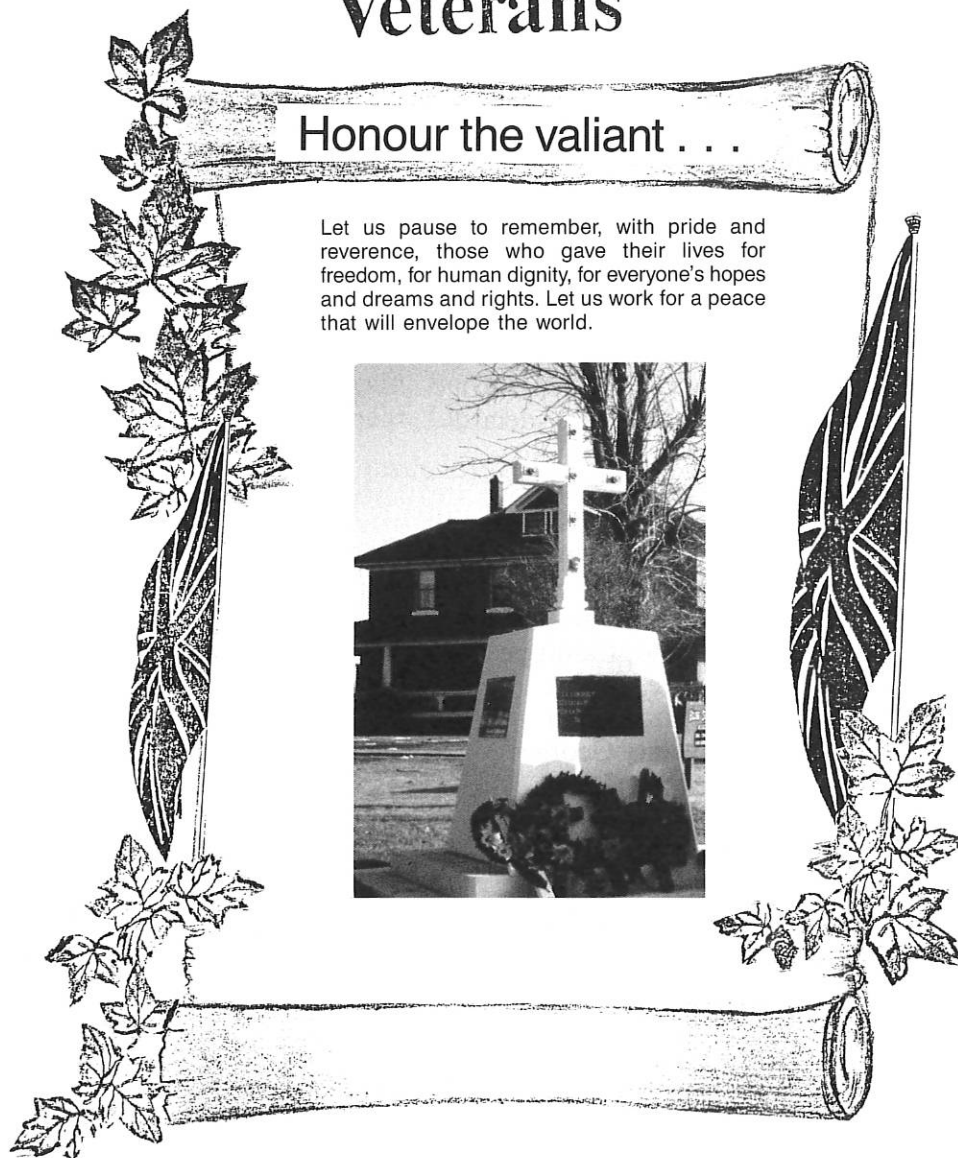

Air Cadets in Legal

The Royal Canadian Air Cadet, Legal Squadron #593, was formed in 1953. The sponsoring body was the Legal Branch of the Royal Canadian Legion. The Squadron was associated with #435 Air Transport Squadron of the Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) at the Canadian Forces Base (CFB) Namao. Liaison with us was maintained by one of their pilots, Flight Lieutenant Dobbin. At least once a year #435 Squadron had the cadets over to Namao for a tour of the Base and usually a flight in a Hercules aircraft. Uniforms, shoes and equipment were provided by the Supply Section at CFB Namao.

I served as Commanding Officer of the Squadron from its inception to 1964. Other officers and instructors were Ted Tétreau, Marcel Dauphinais, Gus Mireault, Léo Toupin, Bert Telford, Andy Wynnychuk, Ralph Sigouin, Art

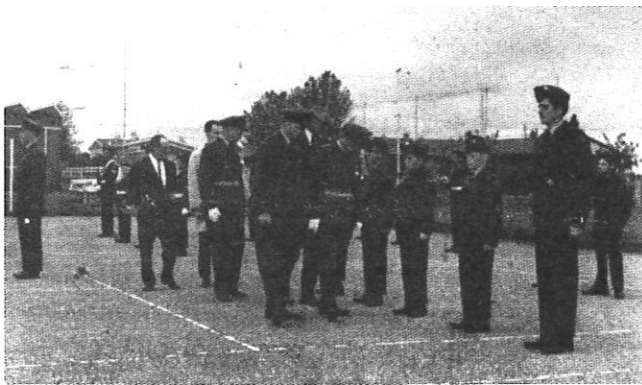
Demers, Hervé St-Onge and other Legion members. Annual inspections of the Squadron were done each year by members of the RCAF Training command, CFB Namao and the sponsoring committee of the Legion.

When the Drum and Bugle band was formed, two instructors from Edmonton trained the cadets. The drums were acquired from Pakistan, the bugles from the Edmonton Boys Band. I (Tom Fink) got the Glockenspiel, so well played by Raymond Titiryn. The band played on many occasions in Legal, St. Albert and in a number of Edmonton Exhibition parades. They also participated in the opening of the Co-op store on 82nd Street.

As I recall, we had about 35 cadets each year at the weekly meetings. About 10 were selected as our quota to attend the annual Summer Camp in Vancouver, British Columbia. I venture to say this was the highlight of the year for them.

In the early 1960's, I was in charge of the cadets from Northern Alberta who took the Flying Scholarship course at the Edmonton Flying Club. Two of the Legal cadets, Clifford Hunting and Antoine Paquin, qualified to attend and both received their private pilot's license.

The boys who attended the cadet program were keen and cooperative with the staff. As in any group some members stood out and made a real

contribution to the program. I hesitate to name them for fear, after these many years, of missing someone. I feel I would be remiss if I didn't mention Marcel Bergevin, Art Derrien, Laurier Boisvert, Raymond Titiryn, Clifford Hunting and Donald Roberts among others.

Well done Cadets and Legion members! It was a pleasure to have been associated with you.

L'Escadron #435 des Cadets de l'Air de Legal a été organisé en 1953, parrainé par la Légion de Legal. L'escadron était lié avec l'escadron 435 du transport aérien du RCAF à CFB Namao. Un de leurs pilotes, Lieutenant Dobbins, assurait la liaison. Au moins une fois par an, il faisait venir les cadets à Namao pour faire un tour de la base, et d'habitude, pour faire un vol dans un avion de transport Hercules. Le centre de ravitaillement de CFB Namao fournissait les uniformes, les chaussures et tout le matériel pour les cadets.

Demers, Hervé St-Onge ainsi que d'autres membres de la Légion. Les membres de la RCAF, CFB Namao et le comité parrain de la Légion faisaient les inspections annuelles de l'escadron.

Quand la fanfare a été organisée, deux instructeurs d'Edmonton l'ont prise en charge. Les tambours venaient du Pakistan et les clairons, du Edmonton Boys Band. Tom Fink a procuré le carillon tubulaire, si bien joué par Raymond Titiryn. La fanfare a joué à Legal à plusieurs reprises et elle a aussi participé à plusieurs défilés de l'Exposition d'Edmonton chaque juillet. La fanfare a aussi participé à la grande ouverture officielle du magasin Co-op sur la 82e rue à Edmonton.

Ils avaient chaque année environ 35 cadets à leurs réunions hebdomadaires. Une dizaine d'entre eux étaient choisis pour participer au camp d'été annuel à Vancouver (Colombie Britannique). Pour ces jeunes-là, c'était le point culminant de l'année.

Au début des années 1960, Tom Fink était en charge des cadets de la région du nord de l'Alberta qui ont suivi le cours de pilotage offert au Club d'aviation d'Edmonton. Deux cadets, Clifford Hunting et Antoine Paquin, furent parmi ceux choisis pour y participer et les deux ont gagné leurs brevets de pilotage pour avion privé.

Les jeunes qui participaient au programme des Cadets étaient enthousiastes et s'entendaient bien. Comme dans tout groupe, certains individus se sont distingués et ont contribué exceptionnellement au programme; il faut mentionner Marcel Bergevin, Art Derrien, Laurier Boisvert, Raymond Titiryn, Clifford Hunting et Donald Roberts parmi tant d'autres.

The Royal Canadian Legion in Legal – Légion Royale du Canada

The Royal Canadian Legion is an organization of dedicated men and women who made a commitment to their country. They volunteered their services for the defence of their country in time of war and were prepared to make the final sacrifice; in fact, many did. There is a feeling of comradeship between veterans that transcends race and creed. This invisible bond we feel toward each other is very real. The Legion is unique in this respect.

The Legal Branch of the Royal Canadian Legion was formed in 1952, as I recall. The charter members, if my memory is correct were Ted Tétreau, Ben St. Martin, Ralph Sigouin, Hervé St. Onge, Joe Derrien, Marcel Dauphinais, Norman Boisvert, Bob Devost, Andy Wynnychuk, Dick Hunting and myself (Tom Fink). Father Langevin was our Chaplain and later, Father Primeau. Ben St. Martin was Sergeant-at-arms and I was secretary-treasurer. Ralph Sigouin, Hervé St. Onge and others served as president.

One of the reasons for the formation of the Legion was to provide the sponsorship of the Air Cadets. The Legion provided what was needed for the rifle range, the security of the rifles and ammunition, as demanded by the Air Force. The Legion provided the cenotaph in front of the church and organized the annual Remembrance Day parade and church service. The Legion was involved in many community events and cooperated with other organizations. The building of the Recreation Center is a prime example.

Associated with the Legion was the Ladies Auxiliary which was formed in Legal. As I recall Marie-Ange St. Martin was on the executive. The Ladies Auxiliary was also active in the community.

La Légion Royale du Canada est une organisation d'hommes et de femmes dédiés qui se sont donnés au service de leur pays. En temps de guerre, ils ont offert leurs services à la défense de leur pays tout en étant préparés à y laisser leur vie. Le sentiment de camaraderie parmi les vétérans transcende toute race et tout crédo, raison pour laquelle la Légion est unique. Je crois que le chapitre de Legal de la Légion Royale du Canada a été créé en 1952. Les membres de la charte étaient, si je me souviens bien, Ted Tétreau, Ben St-Martin, Ralph Sigouin, Hervé St-Onge, Joe Derrien, Marcel

Dauphinois, Norman Boisvert, Bob Devost, Andy Wynnychuk, Dick Hunting et moi-même. Le père Langevin était notre aumonier, suivi du père Primeau. Ben St-Martin était Sergent-aux-armes et j'étais secrétaire-trésorier. Ralph Sigouin et Hervé St-Onge, entr'autres, furent présidents.

Le parrainage des Cadets de l'Air fut l'une des raisons pour fonder la Légion. Celle-ci s'occupa du champ de tir, de la sécurité des fusils et de l'approvisionnement des munitions pour la Force de l'Air. La Légion fit installer le cénotaphe devant

l'église et organisa la parade et la messe annuelle du Jour du Souvenir. De plus, la Légion s'est impliquée dans plusieurs projets communautaires et a parfois coopéré avec d'autres organisations comme ce fut le cas pour la construction du centre récréatif.

En association avec la Légion, on fonda aussi les Dames Auxiliaires de Legal. Je crois que Marie-Ange St-Martin était sur l'exécutif. Ce groupe était aussi très impliqué auprès de la communauté.

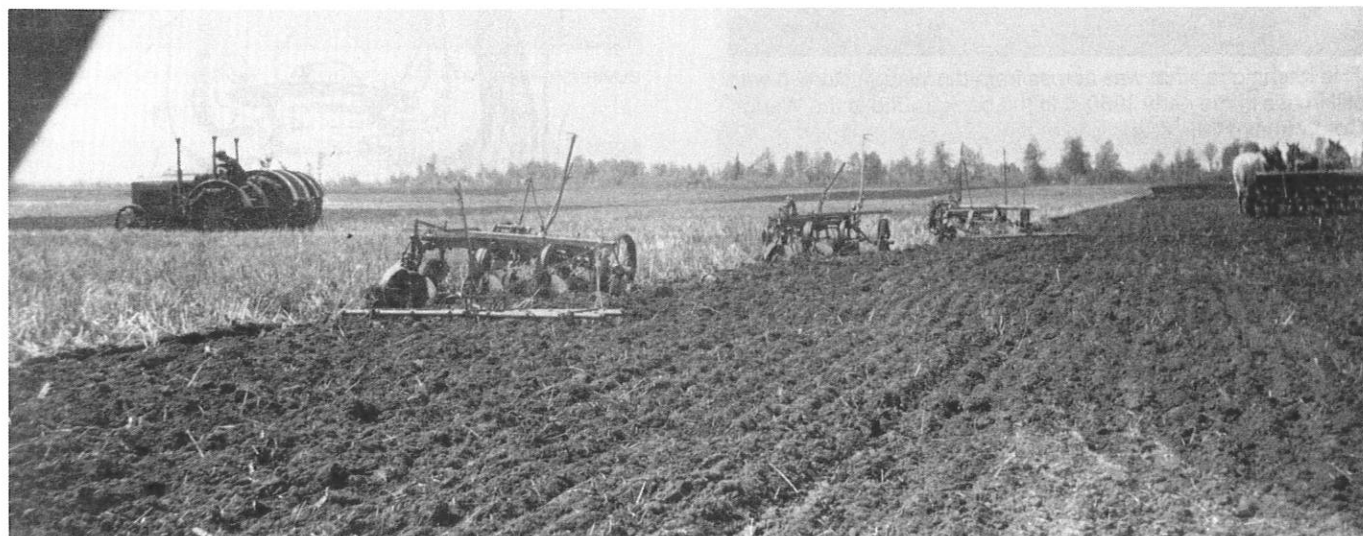

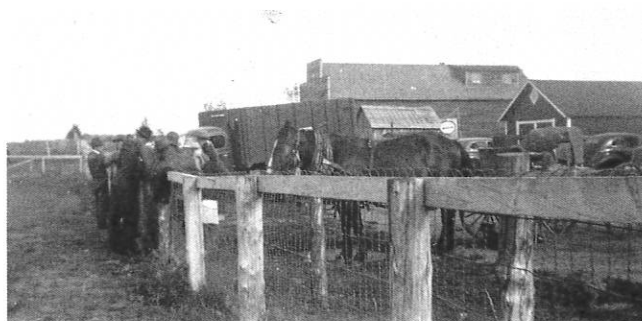

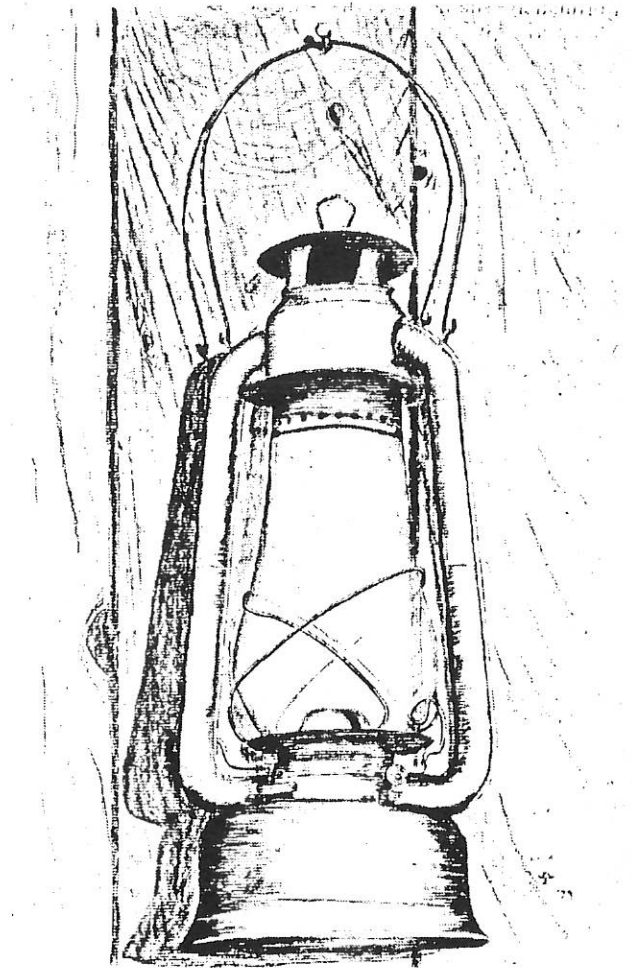

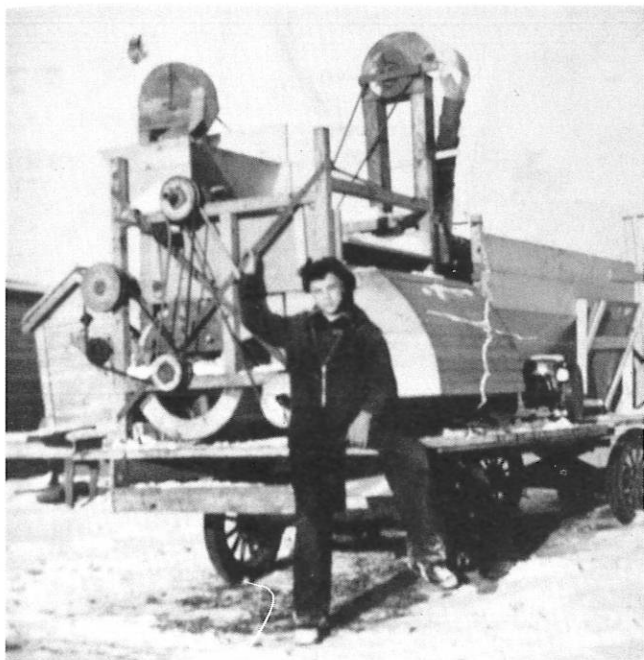

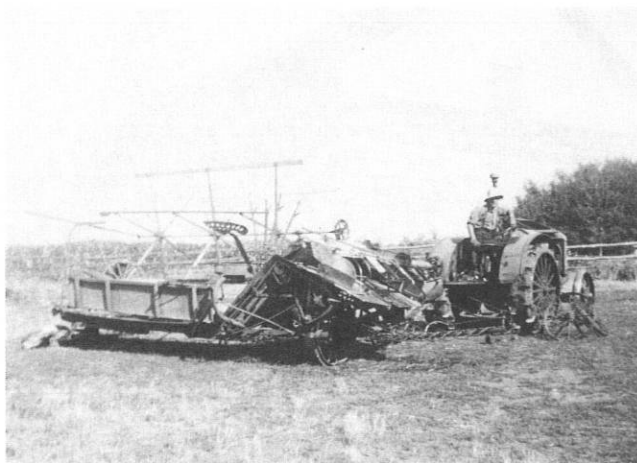
"We didn't have electric lights, of course. In the house, they had a better lamp but they weren't practical at the barn, so we had a lantern to milk the cow after dark.

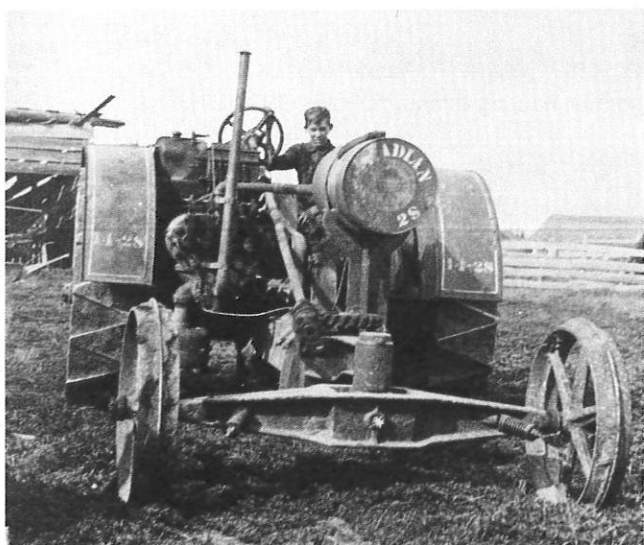

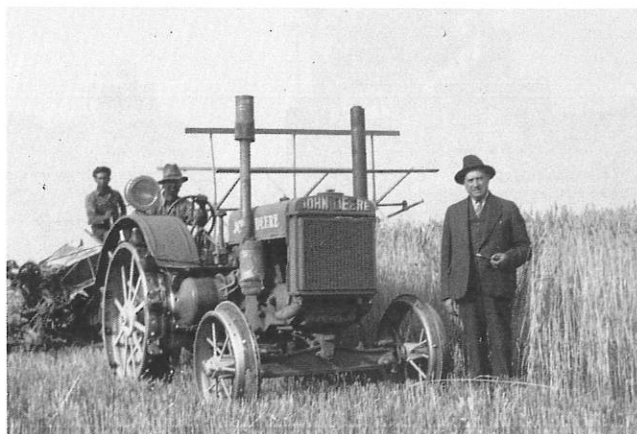

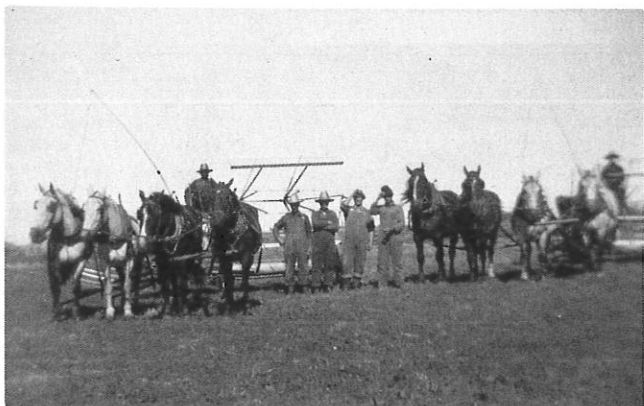

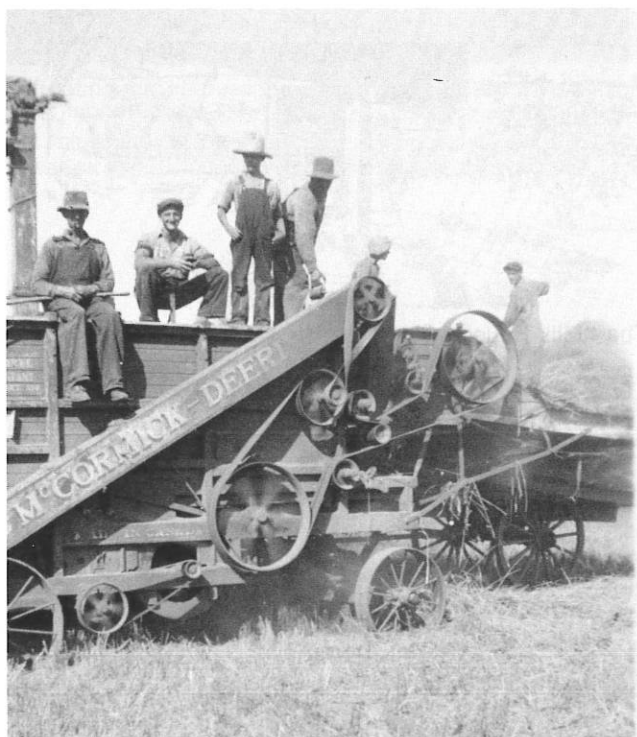

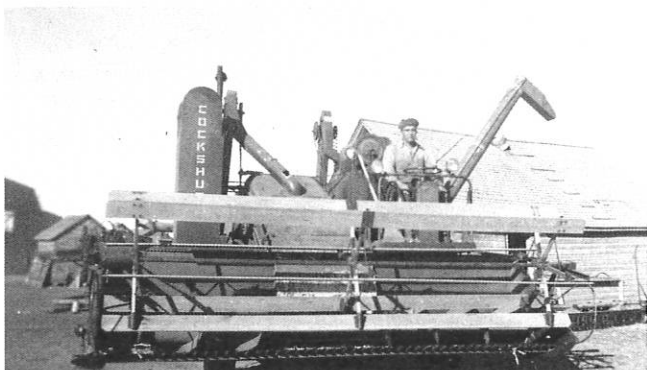

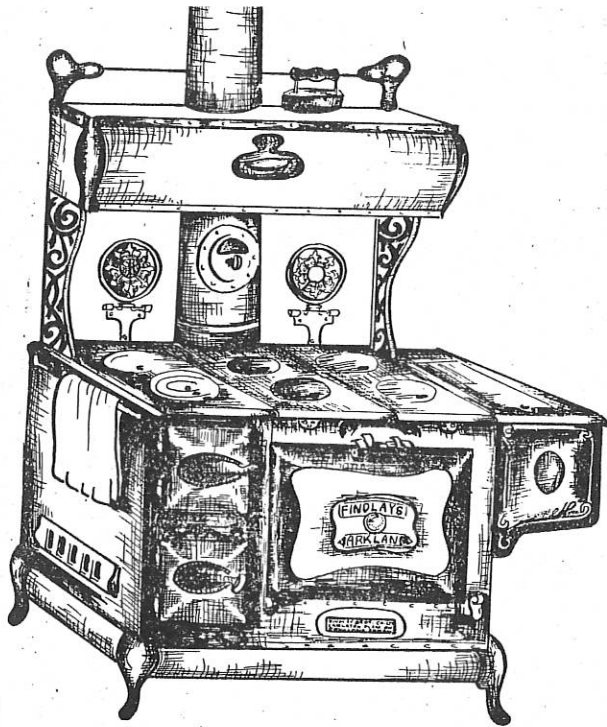

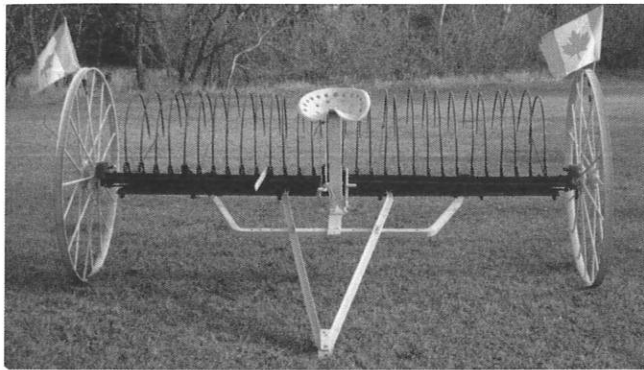

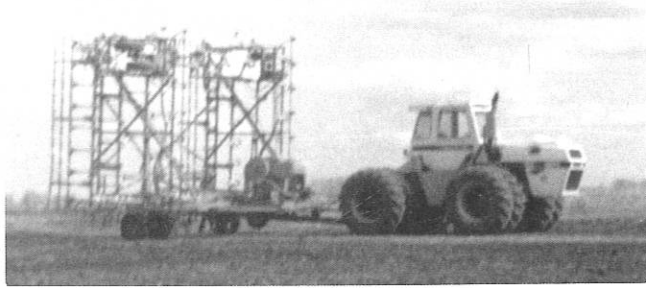

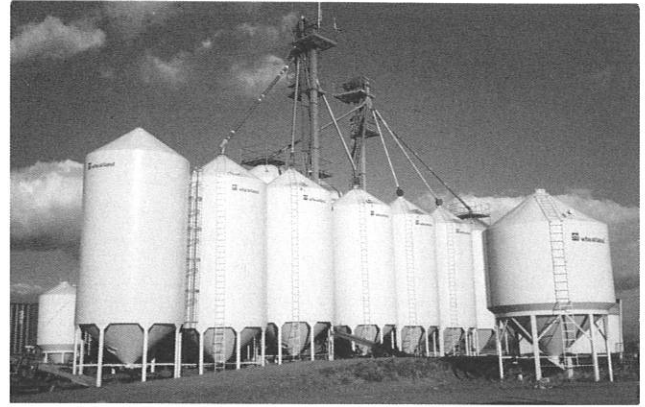

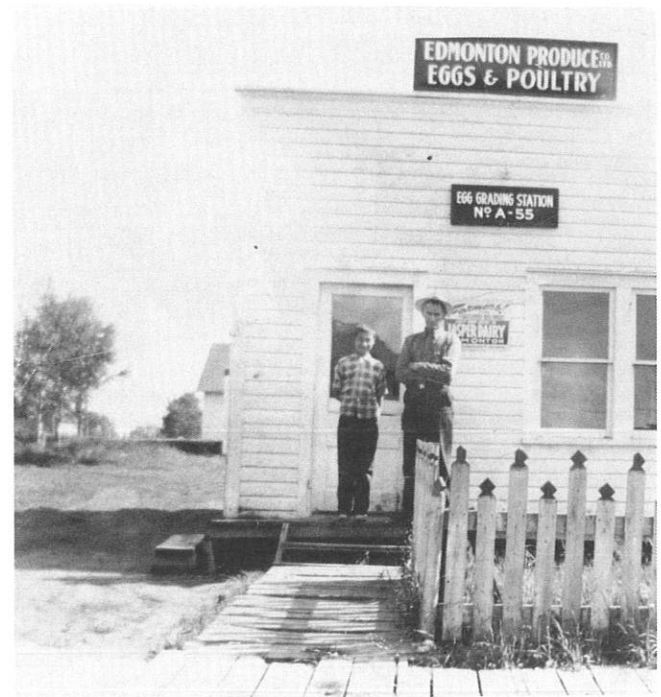

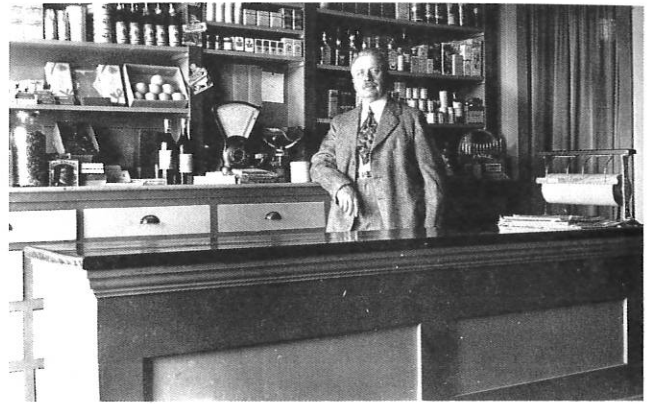

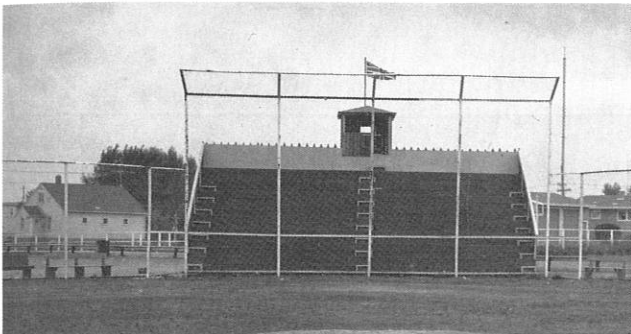

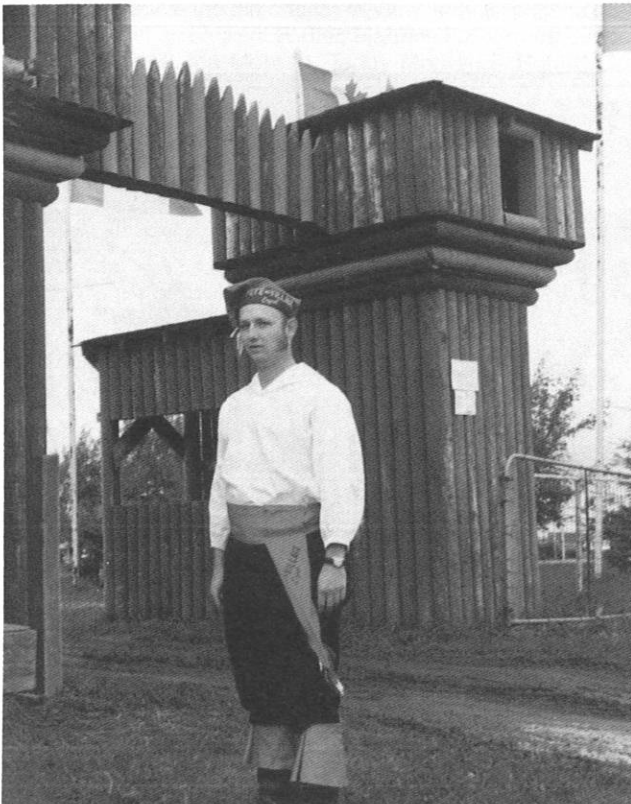

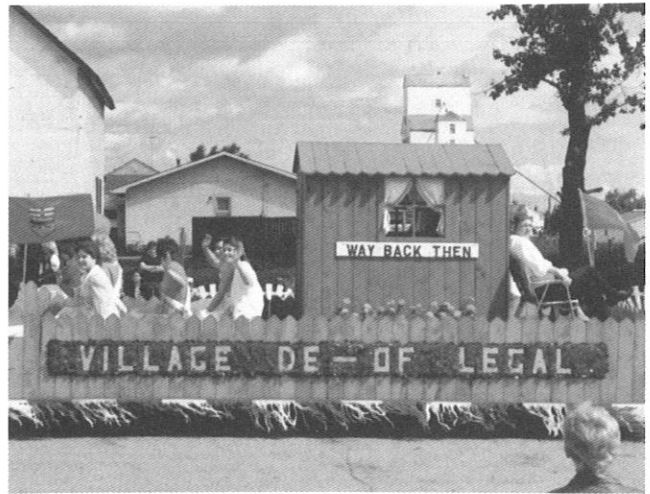

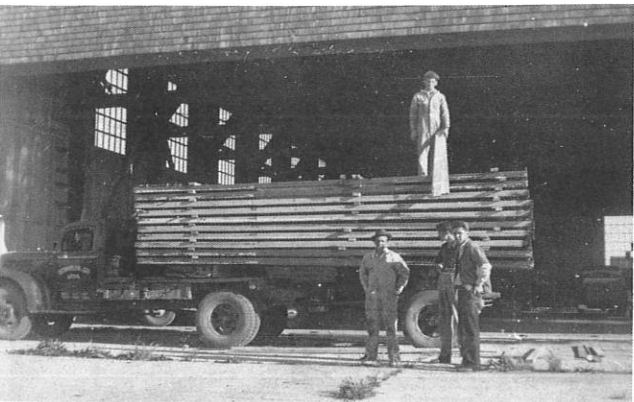

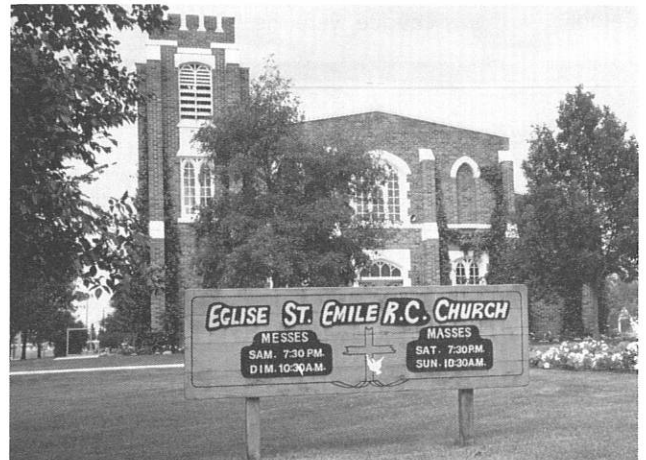

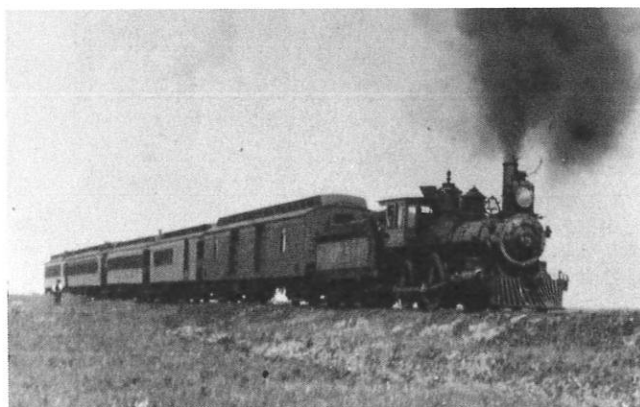

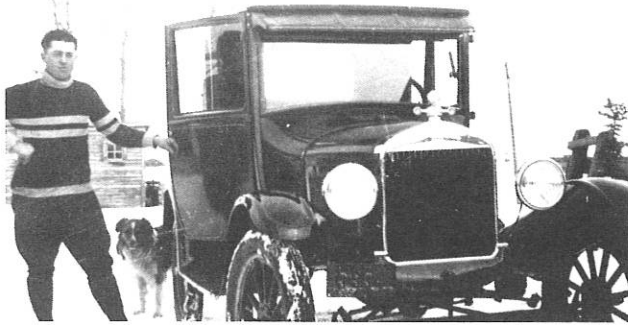

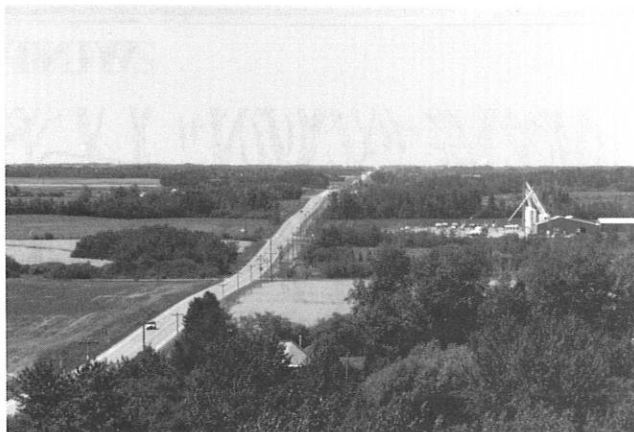

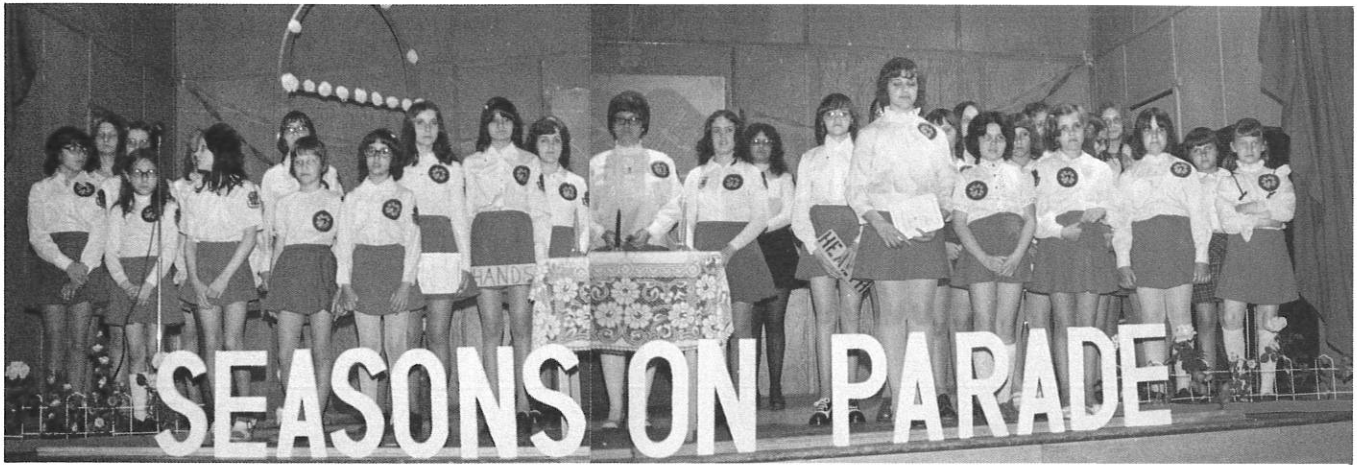

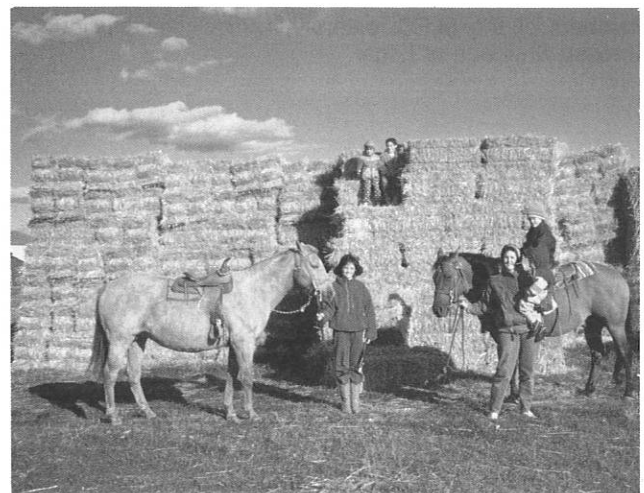
